# **HOLY WEEK & EASTER SERVICES**



Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on April 9. Holy Eucharist will be celebrated that morning at 8 a.m. and 10 a.m.

We will have a Maundy Thursday service at 7 p.m. on April 13. A service of the Stations of the Cross will be held at 3 p.m. on Good Friday, April 14, with an evening Good Friday service at 7 p.m.

The Great Vigil of Easter will take place at 7 p.m. on Saturday, April 15. During this service, we will kindle a new fire and renew our baptismal vows. The service culminates in the first Eucharist of Easter in celebration of the risen Christ.

The good news of Easter will be celebrated with Holy Eucharist at one 9 a.m. service on April 16. Children of all ages are invited to attend a special Easter activity in the Apple house at 9 a.m. that morning, and we'll have an Easter egg hunt after the service.

We will have a pitch-in Coffee Hour after the 9 a.m. service Easter morning. Please bring a snack to share if you would like to visit after the service.

# Holy Eucharist with Healing

Our Saturday evening healing service will be April 1, at 5:30 p.m. Everyone is welcome to attend the service, which includes healing of mind, body, and spirit through laying on of hands, prayers, and anointing with holy oil. Holy Eucharist will also be celebrated at this peaceful service. The May service will be on May 13.

The Stations of the Cross are a meditation on fourteen incidents depicting the walk of Jesus Christ to his death, starting with Pilate condemning Jesus, and ending with Jesus being placed in the tomb. One last service of the Stations of the Cross will be on Good Friday, April 14, at 3 p.m.
