
## Service Change Sunday, April 8

### All About Peeps!

It's a sure sign of spring and Easter when Peeps marshmallow chicks show up in the stores! Here are a few fun facts about Peeps:



- In 1953, it took 27 hours to create one Peeps marshmallow chick. Today, thanks to advances in technology, it takes six minutes.
- An average of 5.5 million Peeps are made every day.
- Just Born candy company produces enough Peeps marshmallow candies in one year to circle the earth twice.
- Yellow and white Peeps chicks and bunnies came first, followed by pink, lavender, blue, green, and orange.
- Peeps come in several flavors, including birthday cake, bubble gum, candy cane, sweet lemonade, and pancakes and syrup.
- If you had 8,000 Peeps bunnies, and you stood them in a straight vertical line, you could reach the top of the Willis Tower (formerly the Sears Tower) in Chicago.
- In 1999, a pair of scientists at Emory University—dubbed “Peeps Investigators”—decided to test the theory that Peeps are an indestructible food. In addition to a microwave, the pair tested the candy's vulnerability to tap water, boiling water, acetone, and sulfuric acid (they survived them all). When they upped the ante with some Phenol, the only things that didn't disappear were the eyes, which are made of carnauba wax.
