Summer Sunday School

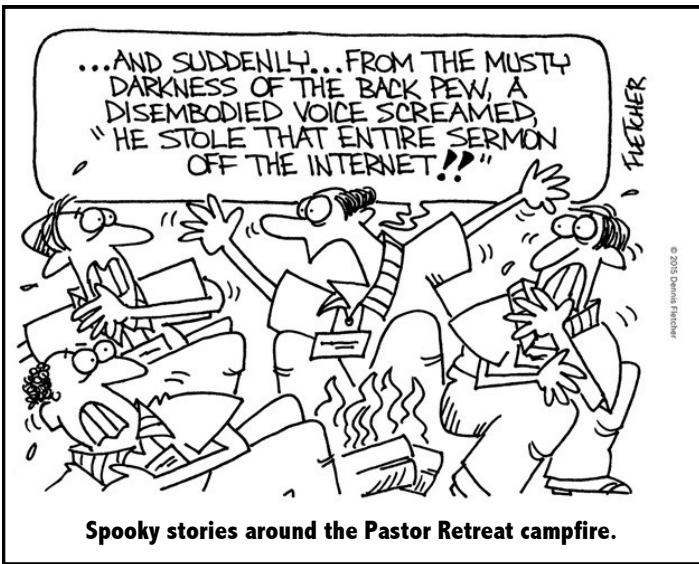
Hey kids!

There's a map that has what's planted in the gardens, and a list of garden chores to choose from. Here are some of the tasks that you could do when you come to help:



- Weed the Memorial Garden
- Weed the flower beds around the church building
- Weed and maintain the flower bed by the sign at the church's entrance
- Remove the spent daffodil foliage
- Divide the daylilies and replant elsewhere or take home
- Prune the rose bushes
- Cut dead limbs off ornamental trees
- Deadhead flowers
- Trim bushes and shrubs
- Water flowers
